Diary Entry (Lesson 1 – Three Questions)

Imagine you are the hermit. Write a diary entry describing your thoughts on the king's visit and how you helped him realize the answers to his three questions. Focus on using descriptive language and expressing your feelings.

2. Comic Strip Illustration (Lesson 2 – A Gift of Chappals)

Illustrate the story as a comic strip, showing key events creatively. Add speech bubbles and use vivid language to capture emotions and important moments.

Travel Vlog Script

Pick any historical place you know about or would like to visit. Write a travel vlog script describing the place, its culture, and main attractions. Use adjectives and adverbs to make your descriptions engaging.

Advertisement Creation

Create an advertisement for a product (real or imaginary) using at least 5 adjectives. Make sure your advertisement is persuasive and catchy, highlighting the best features of the product.

5. Illustrated Poster on Ruskin Bond & Rabindranath Tagore

Design an illustrated poster highlighting key facts, famous works, and interesting anecdotes about the life of Ruskin Bond and Rabindranath Tagore. Use concise language and clear images to showcase the writers.

Determiners Activity

Story Using Given Words

8. Poem on Books or Holidays

Write a short poem (4–6 lines) on your bookmark about books, learning, or holidays. Decorate the bookmark creatively. Focus on rhyme, rhythm, and creativity in your writing.

Word Puzzle Challenge

Solve any three-word puzzles that you have come across in newspapers, children's magazines, or the internet. After solving them, paste the puzzles along with their solutions in the file. You can choose from crossword puzzles, word searches, anagram challenges, or any other fun language-related puzzles.

10. Survey of Textbooks

Conduct a survey of your English textbook. In your survey, include the following details:

- Number of Prose Pieces: Count and list the number of prose selections included in the textbook.
- Number of Poems: Count and list the number of poems included in the textbook.
- Themes: Highlight the major themes covered in the prose and poems. For example, themes might include friendship, nature, courage, adventure, love, or social issues.

Select any five brands of aerated soft drinks and fruit juices (e.g., Coca-Cola, Fanta, Real, Tropicana, Slice, etc.). Create a comparison chart including:

- Brand Name
- · Type (Soft Drink / Fruit Juice)
- · Nutrient Content (Sugar, Calories, Vitamins, etc.)
- · Price (per 250 ml or 500 ml bottle)
- · Advantages (e.g., refreshment, Vitamin content)
- · Disadvantages (e.g., sugar content, preservatives)
- Use photographs, wrappers, logos, and illustrations to make your chart attractive.
- Conclusion: Write a short paragraph suggesting which type of beverage is better for health and why.

Herbarium Preparation 📽

Topic: Classification and Collection of Plant Leaves

Create a Herbarium File by collecting and pasting dried leaves (3 each) from any 3 of the following categories: a)
Cereals b) Fruits c) Vegetables d) Spices e) Medicinal Plants

For each plant leaf, write:

- · Name of the Plant
- · Any two unique facts or benefits (e.g., medicinal use, nutritional value)

Keep the leaves pressed and dried properly. Label each one clearly and neatly.

Case-Based Science Questions

a) The Case of Rishi's Hiccups

Read the situation and answer: Little Rishi got hiccups while watching cartoons and eating fast. His brother gave him water and explained that eating too quickly can cause hiccups. Their father added that it's not due to someone remembering you — that's a myth!

Answer the following:

- 1. What is a hiccup?
- 2. Why do we get hiccups scientifically?
- 3. What values are shown by Rishi (e.g., curiosity, willingness to learn)?
- b) Gallbladder Removal Case

A girl named 'A' had her gall bladder removed due to stones. She now finds it difficult to digest certain foods.

- · What kind of foods would cause problems?
- · Why does this happen after gall bladder removal?

Write the answers in a notebook or A4 sheet. You may include small diagrams for better explanation.

Project Work

- A) Diagram Project Draw and label a large, neat diagram of human lungs on chart paper.
- · Use color pencils
- · Mention important parts (trachea, bronchi, alveoli, etc.)

B) Model Making – Eco-Friendly Innovation Use old plastic bottles to create a planter model for small plants.

You can make hanging planters or a recycled bottle garden

Add a label with the plant name and benefits

Take pictures of the model with you and your plant

Observation-Based Activity &

Topic: Observe Changes Around You – "Science in Daily Life"

Observe your surroundings for 7 consecutive days. Record any 5 scientific observations related to:

- · Weather (e.g., cloud types, temperature changes)
- · Plants (growth patterns, response to sunlight)
- · Insects or animals (movement, behavior)
- · Water usage or waste around you
- · Any natural or physical changes (e.g., evaporation, rusting, melting)
- Create an Observation Table like this:

Date What I Observed Type of Change Scientific Reason/Explanation

1 June Water puddle drying Evaporation Due to heat, water changes to vapor

Add a short reflection on how observing these changes helped you understand science in daily life.

Classification Activity

Topic: Sorting and Grouping Everyday Substances

- Classify them into two groups based on any one of the following criteria:

- Make a table or Venn diagram to show the classification. Include pictures if possible.


